Answer the following questions in a few poignant sentences.

1.	Describe a "Model" Immigrant group during the Jacksonian Era. Provide an example of a group that fits this description from the old era of immigration. In comparison give an example of a group that was viewed negatively and explain the difference.
2.	Explain why the Indian Removal Act of 1830 was deemed Unconstitutional by Chief Justice Marshall in 1835, and how Andrew Jackson responded to this Supreme Court Decision in <i>Worcester v. Georgia</i> . What regional divisions did the Indian Removal create in the United States?
3.	Even though the <i>Amistad v. The United States</i> favored Cinque/Singbe, the 44 Africans kidnapped from Sierra Leone, and the abolitionist movement, it didn't address the moral issue of slavery. In a few sentences explain why not.
4.	How did Henry Clay's America Plan create further sectionalism (Regional division) between the North and South during the Jacksonian Era?
5.	During the 1830s women workers began the first powerful organized strikes. These strikes took place in the textile industry. Why do you think they felt compelled to take action against their employers? How is this a further shift from Femme Covert?
