PROPAGANDA: /prä-pə-gan-də,/n. (Latin, propaganda-- for propagating the faith)

- 1. : the spreading of ideas, information, or rumor <u>for the purpose of helping or injuring</u> <u>an institution, a cause, or a person</u>.
- 2. : ideas, facts, or allegations spread deliberately to further one's cause or to damage an opposing cause ; *also* : a public action having such an effect

RHETORIC: / re-tə-rik/ n. (Middle English *rethorik*, from Anglo-French *rethorique*, from Latin *rhetorica*, from Greek *rhētorikē*, literally, art of oratory)

- 1. the art of speaking or writing effectively: as a: the study of principles and rules of composition formulated by critics of ancient times b: the study of writing or speaking as a means of communication or persuasion
- 2. a: skill in the effective use of speech b: a type or mode of language or speech ; *also* : insincere or grandiloquent language



- Use strong EMOTIONAL rhetoric
- Cleary show the target audience (British laborers, American Men)
- Show at least three WWI visual characteristics (Spiked Helmet, Lusitania, Union Jack)
